Amy Weinstein For themselves	<p>It is imperative that people know who agents or police are that are interacting with them. The fact that-so far-ICE Officers have hid their identities, their branch of service, etc., further cements the fear of all officers. Since, by state statute peace officers are allowed to keep the peace, even in ICE events, it is extremely important that federal ICE officers are known as who they are not hiding their position. All people in the US deserve basic rights and privileges, not to be met by thugs in disguise who hide their identities and use excessive force. I am for all aspects of this new bill.</p>
Elsa Alcala For themselves	<p>My name is Elsa Alcala, and I am here to support this bill. I am a registered Democrat in Fort Collins, Colorado, where I have lived since 2020.</p> <p>For over 30 years, I have been a licensed attorney in Texas, and for 20 of those years, I was a state judge. I was the first Latina elected statewide in Texas to the Court of Criminal Appeals, the state's criminal supreme court, where I served for seven years. After I retired, I decided to live my later years of life in Colorado.</p> <p>Until this past year, I never worried about whether I would be harassed by a government agent. Today, I know better. I have read numerous stories and seen videos showing ICE and CBP agents harassing people who look like me. I keep my passport handy, as well as a laminated copy of a card with my birth certificate. I have read stories describing how ICE and CBP agents arrested or detained people even after they presented proof of citizenship. Brown and black people are being treated as second class citizens who must carry proof of citizenship, and we must always be prepared for</p>

	<p>harassment by federal agents acting as though we do not have constitutional rights.</p> <p>In many situations that I have read about or watched online, ICE and CBP had no probable cause or reasonable suspicion to detain people. They are harassing people on the street, at hospitals, courthouses, and schools, and they use fake stories to gain entrance. ICE and CBP ignore the 4th Amendment.</p> <p>Outside of undercover work or medical needs, agents have no need to wear face masks, and they should wear clear identifying information. Regular people need to know if the person walking up to them with a gun is a government agent or a criminal.</p> <p>I have seen videos of ICE and CBP agents violently pulling people from cars, screaming at people, aggressively grabbing people, escalating stressful situations, and even murdering people. The face masks and absence of identification protects those bad agents from being held accountable.</p> <p>For these reasons, I agree with the bill's requirements that agents may not wear masks and must identify themselves. I have lived in Fort Collins, Colorado since 2010 and in Colorado since 2005.</p> <p>I am shocked and saddened to see what is happening in our country. We Americans have an expectation that federal law enforcement agencies (ICE and CBP) would behave as professionals and respect individuals' 1st and 4th amendment rights. Instead, we are seeing masked paramilitary forces with no identification, in unmarked vehicles, breaking windshields, pulling people from their vehicles and homes, and using extreme force, including chemical spray, to harass and detain individuals with seeming impunity. <p>Elsa Alcala For themselves</p>	<p>Written Testimony on HB 26-1276 Chairman Representative Mabry and members of the committee, I thank you for the opportunity to present my written testimony today in favor of HB 26-1276.</p>

	<p>My name is Elsa Alcala, and I am here to support this bill. I am a registered Democrat in Fort Collins, Colorado, where I have lived since 2020. I am currently a 30-year licensed attorney in Texas, and I am a retired 20-year Texas state court judge.</p> <p>I have been doing research about the immigration detention facility in Aurora and the proposed Big Horn Detention Center in Hudson, at the site where a prison was formerly located from 2009 to 2014. It is my understanding that a contract entered December 1, 2025, provides that the facility will be run for profit by a private company, The GEO Group. For profit facilities are known for their abuses of prisoners and detainees. There are numerous complaints against GEO for inhumane treatment of detainees, including a federal lawsuit recently decided against it by the Supreme Court of the United States. Allegations include sexual assault, forced labor and inedible food with worms in it. For those reasons, this proposed bill is critical to ensuring that state health authorities enter these facilities in Colorado to attempt to ensure that they are not concentration camps disguised as immigration facilities.</p> <p>It is critically important that these facilities comply with licensing requirements that other places with large groups must meet. Most detainees have no criminal record. They came to the United States to work, and they typically perform thankless jobs for low pay. At a minimum, they should be detained in safe, clean, and appropriate housing, and they should be treated humanely with a goal that people may maintain their dignity.</p> <p>I saw that the fiscal cost of the bill is \$238,000, which is a low price to ensure that there are no concentration camps in our back yard.</p> <p>I also agree with the other provisions of the bill.</p>
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	<p>I thank each committee members for the opportunity to provide this written testimony.</p>

Plaintiff is the lawful owner of the property listed in (Exhibit B) and is entitled to possession of it. Plaintiff asserts that the Avon Police Department seized this property during a forced entry into Plaintiff's residence without a search warrant (see Exhibit A), even though the ERPO order required surrender of four firearms within 48 hours only (see Exhibit C). Additional items listed in (Exhibit B) were taken and remain in Defendant's possession. The entry and seizure are recorded on Plaintiff's security cameras (see Exhibit D).

5. Plaintiff's property is wrongfully being detained by the defendant against the plaintiff claim of the right to possession

Defendant continues to retain possession of the property listed in (Exhibit B) even though the order required surrender of firearms only and did not authorize seizure or continued detention of the additional items listed in (Exhibit B). Plaintiff asserts that the property is therefore being wrongfully detained.

6. The means by which the defendants came into possession of the property and the specific facts constituting detention against the right of the plaintiffs to possession are as follows: (states the source of your right to the property how the defendants took possession and why you believe the defendants is/are wrongfully detaining the property from you)

Defendant came into possession of the property when the Avon Police Department entered Plaintiff's residence while enforcing an ERPO order requiring surrender of firearms within 48 hours only (Exhibit C). Items listed in (Exhibit B) include property beyond the firearms referenced in the order. Defendant continues to retain those items despite Plaintiff's ownership and request for their return. The firearms referenced in the order were later recovered by law enforcement at a different location.

9. Plaintiff has made demand upon the defendants for return of the property. Plaintiff has not received the property from the defendants despite such demand and continues to be deprived of the use and enjoyment of the property.

Plaintiff hereby demands the return of the property listed in (Exhibit B) through the filing of this complaint. Defendant continues to retain possession of the property, and Plaintiff is deprived of the use and possession of the property.

11. Pursuant to CRCP 104 or CRCCP 404. The plaintiff is entitled to an order of this court, directing the defendants to restore the plaintiff possession of the property listed in Exhibit A", or for judgment for the value thereof, if delivery cannot be made, and for damages for detention of the property.

Plaintiff requests that the Court order Defendant to restore to Plaintiff possession of the property listed in (Exhibit B). If delivery cannot be made, Plaintiff requests judgment for the value of the property, not to exceed \$25,000, together with damages for detention of the property and any other relief the Court deems just and proper.



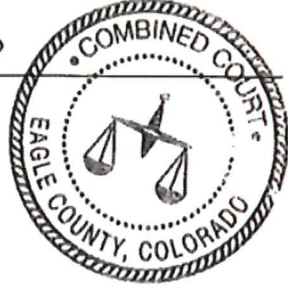

I, Chief Greg Daly request this Court to issue a Temporary Extreme Risk Protection Order, and in support of this request do hereby swear/affirm the following under penalty of perjury:

- I am a family or household member to the respondent. My relationship to the respondent is:
 - I am related by blood, marriage, or adoption to the respondent.
 - I have a child in common with the respondent. (Regardless of marriage or whether you have lived with the respondent at any time.)
 - I regularly reside or have regularly resided with the respondent within the last six months.
 - I am a domestic partner of the respondent.
 - I have a biological or legal parent-child relationship with the respondent. (Including stepparents and stepchildren, grandparents and grandchildren.)
 - I am acting or have acted as the respondent's legal guardian.
 - I am the spouse or former spouse of the Respondent.
 - In the past I have been in or am presently in an unmarried couple relationship with the Respondent.
- I am a law enforcement officer, or I represent a law enforcement agency. Name of law enforcement agency: Avon Police Department, Incorporated Town of Avon, County of Eagle, State of Colorado.
 Your affiant, Chief Greg Daly of the Avon Police Department, being first duly sworn upon oath, and provides the following information in support of the Petition for Temporary Extreme Risk Protection Order filed in this action, which information was obtained by me personally, from the records of this Department, and from conversations with other law enforcement officers.

 I reviewed the records of the Avon Police Department, as well as On Call Records, which contains reports from various Eagle County law enforcement agencies. Searching those databases and from speaking with other Law Enforcement Officers, I learned the below in part:
 - Mark Goodban (DOB 09/12/1969) poses a significant risk of causing personal injury to self or others by having in his or her custody or control a firearm or by purchasing, possessing, or receiving a firearm.

Select all applicable reasons and provide detailed statements and information of the grounds supporting the issuance of a Temporary Extreme Risk Protection Order:

There has been a recent act or credible threat of violence by the respondent against self or others, whether or not such violence or credible threat of violence involves a firearm.
Explain in detail:

AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT CRIMINAL CASE # 21-424: On July 21, 2021, Goodban was arrested and charged with Felony Menacing-Real/Simulated Weapon (Primary), Harassment, Reckless Driving, and Careless Driving. On April 4, 2022, Goodban pled guilty, and the case was closed.

On July 21, 2021, Mr. Goodban was charged with the above charges for brandishing a knife during a road rage incident. Vail Public Safety Communication's Center (VPSCC) aired a road rage in progress near roundabout number three which is located at Avon Rd. and E Beaver Creek Blvd. Avon, CO. 81620, stating that the person was driving a Red Dodge Ram with a ladder rack on it. While in route, an Avon police officer called the reporting party/victim (RP) and he stated that he was pulling into the 7-Eleven parking lot. The Avon police officer told him that we would meet him at that location. After pulling into the 7-Eleven parking lot, Avon police met with the victim. The victim stated that the driver of the Red Ram was tailgating him, honking at him, and flipped him off and stated to dispatch at 15:57 that the driver "got out and showed the victim a (green in color and 4" blade) knife" and stated, "Quit following me or you will see what the consequences will be". The victim then stated to the driver of the Ram that he was calling 911. The driver of the Red Ram got back in his vehicle and drove Westbound on West Beaver Creek Blvd. The driver was later identified as Mark Goodban. The victim stated that he felt threatened due to the actions of Goodban and was in fear for his life when Goodban was brandishing the knife. The victim stated that his fear was a seven out of ten, with ten being the worst.

There have been a pattern of acts or credible threats of violence by the respondent within the past year, including but not limited to acts or credible threats of violence by the respondent against self or others.
Explain in detail:

AVON CALL FOR SERVICE #22-2062028

On March 03, 2022, at approximately 1551 hours, Goodban's neighbor (reporting party) called to report him hearing Goodban make threats to someone on the phone. The neighbor could hear Goodban screaming through the walls. Goodban was also pounding on his walls which was disrupting the neighbors. The RP lives in B-4 and Goodban lives in B-3. They share a wall.

The reporting party had requested that the Avon Police Department file for a red flag order against Goodban and doesn't feel safe living next to him knowing that Goodban has weapons. The RP explained Goodban was screaming at 45 or more decibels. The neighbor heard "YOU'RE A FUCKING LIAR, YOUR'RE GONNA GET IT, THAT'S WHERE I DRAW A LINE IN THE SAND!"

The last time the RP heard Goodban disrupt the complex was in January 2022.

The RP did not know what kind of weapons Goodban had but said back a few years ago there was a flood, and Goodban had a few duffel bags full of weapons. Goodban also has a floor safe.

SUMMIT COUNTY CASE# 21-12977: DISTURBANCE INCIDENT REPORT

Summit County Commissioners were holding a public meeting. The Summit County Sheriff's Office was called due to Mark Goodban being disruptive. Goodban was making anti-mask statements, using profanity, talking on his cell phone, and generally making people feel uncomfortable. When it was Goodban's turn to talk at the podium, he started to talk about the topic of redistricting. Goodban started on a tangent over facemasks. The moderator asked Goodban to limit his comments to the redistricting topic. Goodban responded with the effect of the Governor, or the "Gay Mafia" is changing the map, then stated, "The Gay Mafia Sucks."

Goodban went to his chair and collected his coat. He said loudly to the room, "I guess that's why there's a second amendment." He left the meeting. The sheriff's deputy followed Goodban out of the building keeping a distance. An elected official went up to the sheriff deputy and stated he took that statement as a threat from Goodban.

Numerous people approached and thanked the Sheriff Deputy for being there.

Summit County Sheriff's Office contacted Avon Police Department to verify Goodban's vehicle was at his residence. Once it was confirmed, Summit County Deputy felt it was safe to leave the meeting, and the elected officials and citizens at the meeting were safe to access their vehicles in the parking lot.

AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT CASE # 21-178: SUSPICIOUS INCIDENT – On March 29, 2021, Avon Police Sergeant J. Holmstrom spoke to the "Vail management company" representative, Abel Vega. Vail Management were property management for the Beaver Bench complex, where Mark Goodban lives. Mr. Vega explained that they had been receiving concerning emails from Mr. Goodban in response to their emails requesting Mr. Goodban abide by the rules. The emails expressed frustration with a potential sewage smell in Mr. Goodban's unit. The emails expressed frustration with following Homeowners association rules. The emails were profanity laced and rambling.

On March 29th Sergeant Holmstrom spoke with a party identified as, Tim Kubajak, a representative of the Toyota corporation. Mr. Kubajak stated Mr. Goodban believed his Toyota Tacoma was a "lemon". Mr. Goodban made calls into the Toyota National service center. The call center lines were recorded. Mr. Kubajak provided two recordings. In the recordings, Mr. Goodban made some statements about the shooting in Boulder, Colorado at the King Soopers in which a police officer and multiple citizens were killed. He told the call taker at the end of their conversation "that's how you act". It's unclear if Mr. Goodban meant this as the way Toyota was acting or a future course of action. A second recording included a 30-minute conversation. Towards the end of the conversation Mr. Goodban began to speak about pushing people's buttons and referenced the shooting in Boulder and another in Georgia.

VOICEMAIL'S LEFT FOR ABEL VEGA, PROPERTY MANAGER OF BEAVER BENCH CONDOMINIUMS

02/02/2021 – Mr. Goodban left a message, stating, "Yeah, my name is Mark Goodban, I live in Beaver Bench B-3. You guys are going after me for some plywood. It's been back there since I owned the place since 2006. No idea what you guys are talking about. You're going to have to show me that condo law. Maybe you can charge me 25 bucks again. As of now, you don't have any law. You are not Joe Biden. Where are you coming up with this B.S. Are you dumb?"

04/11/2021 – Mr. Goodban left a message, stating, "You're out of town, must be fucking nice. I'm breathing a bunch of sewage shit. It reeks. You don't want to fix it, you ignore me. You're harassing me. You are intimidating me and pushing my buttons. I don't know how to fix a plumbing pipe that is 114 feet long and corroded. It's 40 years old. You're an asshole (hit's something in the background 6 times) Fuck You!" Disconnects.

04/12/2021 – Mr. Goodban left a message, stating, "Dude; you're a fucking devil worshiper, Asshole! Read your by laws, you God damn son of a Bitch! This is fucking bullshit! You're a fucking Cunt! (hit's something twice in the background) Fuck you! Fix the pipes, stop harassing me. Maybe I'd talk to you nicer, what do you think about that? Be nice to me, and I'd be nice to you, Fucking Dick! Fuck you, fix the sewage pipes asshole. I am shaking and trembling to death. I just took a fucking mold test, and tested God damn Motherfucking positive because you're a fucking Bitch (hits something in the background 3 times). You are going to pay for my refrigerator, my washing machine, my fucking drywall, everything, you're going to pay for the dryer too, because there's holes in it, and my posters, asshole!"

09/06/2021 – Mr. Goodban left a message stating he had a flood in his unit two nights prior and no water and saw plumbers at his unit for several hours and blew up his toilet seat seal. He's been calling the emergency management line, and he was getting "Really Fucking Fired Up." Goodban told Mr. Vega to do his "fucking job and stop "smoking dope."

AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT EMAILS FROM NEIGHBOR OF GOODBANS

Numerous emails between Goodban's neighbor and to an Avon Police Sergeant. The neighbor expressed a desire not to press criminal charges, however, did want the Avon Police Department to pursue a red flag order on Goodban. The neighbor and Goodban share a wall.

January 9, 2022, at 03:14 am

"Slamming and cursing at 3 AM, woke me and my dogs up. He had his front door open and was in his residence cursing at someone over the phone."

December 21, 2021, at 12:00pm

"Again more banging and shouting expletives. Duration 2 min, approximately 8-9 strikes against the wall."

December 18, 2021, at 09:37am

"Loud banging and repeated "fuck you's". 2nd time tonight. I have a friend visiting who, witnessed, and asked "what's going on?"

2. AR-15 type long barreled (20-24" heavy barrel for long range), likely .223 caliber based on magazine well size. It had a higher-power scope with camouflage material wrapped around it.
3. AR "pistol" (very short barrel with no stock or arm brace)

The following are phrases taken from emails sent from Mark Goodban to the Avon Town Council members in chronological order.

AVON POLICE BOLO EMAIL 04/02/2018

A Be On the Look Out (BOLO) went out about Goodban for Officer Safety. A friend of Goodban's called Avon Police Department to report that Goodban showed the friend a camouflaged colored semi-automatic rifle with a scope and bipod on it. The rifle had a bump stock. Goodban also showed the friend several large magazines. When asked why Goodban had the firearms, Goodban didn't answer. The friend was concerned and wanted to report this due to Goodban's behavior sometimes reminded him of the same demeanor as the active shooters the friend has seen on the news.

Use crisis intervention training, when contacting Goodban, and understand that Goodban has displayed anti-government ideologies, sovereign citizen behavior, and some mental health issues.

Goodban's residence was flagged for "Officer Safety"

The concern for using the firearms was alarming enough for Goodban's friend to report him to authorities, because Goodban reminds his friend as a mass shooter personality.

AVON TOWN COUNCIL EMAILS - September 27, 2019

Goodban requests to talk to the lobbyist over the Styrofoam ban.

Goodban demands the following: "A vote for Christians and hunters on to liberal movement for us. 1. Make the town of avon an anti facial recognition town just like Silicon Valley did who actually invented it...Hum why would they ban their own creations.. Well let's ban it as well. 2. Let's make the town of avon a gun owners sanctuary for the pro second amendment (see email attachment for further details)."

AVON TOWN COUNCIL EMAILS October 1, 2019 Email

"I bet your counsel is to stupid to realize that your making bs laws to make me pay extra for meals when i go out I can't handle your shit. Make a facial recognition camera town ban or a pro-gun town then See it from the other side or your just an idiot that needs to get on the trump train, etc...(see email attachment for further details)."

AVON TOWN COUNCIL EMAILS October 16, 2019 Email

Strong opinion against the recycling direction of the Town of Avon.

"I saw a video last week from Mexico where the Mexican farmers drug their Mayor on the back of a car bumper before being arrested. All the mayor did was break his political promises. I think you should be proud to live in the USA us. And respect your freedoms before the laws other libtards create catch up to you hating something standing in your ways. God I love America and it's freedoms (see email attachment for further details)."

AVON TOWN COUNCIL EMAILS January 1, 2020 Email

Strong reaction towards town council in regard to a plastic bag ban and a potential Styrofoam ban/tax. He called the Council numerous derogatory names including, "Socialist Fuckers," "Rich Fuckers," "Go Fuck Yourself," etc...

Goodban compared the Town Council to KKK and Niggers." Goodban compares the citizens of Town of Avon as "slaves" to Town Council's laws.

AVON TOWN COUNCIL EMAILS October 8, 2020

A directive came out due to increasing harassing behavior on Goodban requiring Avon Police to be present when Goodban was at Avon Town Hall.

The below are criminal cases or investigations into criminal behavior by Goodban.

AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT CASE # 2018-50: – HARASSMENT

Goodban was a customer for Brill Insurance Agency and was in the office this day regarding his homeowner's insurance. Goodban had filed multiple claims over issues like loud neighbors, loud water flow noise in the pipes, mold, and other things. Mark had yelled at staff about these issues in the past. John said on 01/04 Mark came into the office and was conversing with the staff about his concerns. He went on a tangent about his water pipe noise. He then asked the staff in an overly emphasized way if they gave discounts to NRA members. John took this as a concerning statement intended to threaten the staff. John said Marks behavior in past communications had been aggressive and angry.

BEAVER CREEK RESORTS – On June 8, 2017, Goodban was permanently trespassed from all Beaver Creek Resort Property for repeated disrespectful and threatening behavior to their employees. Goodban was permanently barred from entering upon any property owned, leased, or controlled by Vail Resorts or its affiliates, including ski terrain, chairlifts/gondolas, restaurants, base area facilities, maintenance facilities, employee housing, open space, parking areas, convention centers, and resort buildings located on or at Beaver Creek Resort and all administrative offices of Vail Resorts, including its Broomfield, CO headquarters and offices located in or around its ski mountains (see attachment for full details on trespass order).

EAGLE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE CASE # 19-187: HARASSMENT-TELEPHONE THREATS

Goodban sent three emails to a homeowner in Beaver Creek about the homeowner not doing enough to help Goodban get his ski pass back after he was trespassed by Beaver Creek Security (June 8, 2017) for an issue unrelated to the homeowner. Goodban felt that the homeowner was at fault due to him working on her property which was the cause of the trespass. These emails were sent over the course of three months. The following is from the case report.

"The Report Party (RP) stated M. Goodban is using his work email; amagictouch007@gmail.com. He has sent the RP three different emails since October 2018.

Email 01-30-19 sent from Goodban

Maybe you'll get a mechanical lean on your place then. You act like a ghost. Are you a physical being? Can you Communicate?

*Are you a drug cartel member? No idea who you are but if someone came to work for me I'd definitely be calling the guy asking his side of the story and not listen to a retarded security fuck that demands \$200 bucks in my driveway for lunch money. Let alone take the guys ski pass
You're probably George Soros that killed the Jews as a child for staying alive in ww2 and probably voted for Nancy Pelosi because of her father dealing heroin in San Francisco"*

Email 10-11-18 at 3:33 PM sent from Goodban

*"Back in June 2017, I washed windows for your company and barely got paid for doing it. I lost my ski pass for life just because your company asked me to work for your ass. Thanks for helping me get back my ski pass. I personally think Helga is nuts and your just as bad if you knew about it the whole time.
That shit ain't right. I expect a reply or I may pursue this matter a little farther. I've cleaned the windows on this house in the past. I'm a homeowner in Avon and can ride a motorcycle to your front gates from my driveway in 30 seconds*

I just find this matter a little rude and your actions along with Beaver Creek has made it impossible to go to work and cost me 10,000's of thousands of dollars of lost revenue from washing windows on your private resort that is actually public lands of forests rented by the USFS."

Email sent on 10-11-18 at 3:39p.m. sent from Goodban

"Here is another video with homeowner special permission of my return same gate 4 months later.

Again why am I being extradited like a military regime from your security?

You never did pay me for the amount of work I did and 2, you never did stick up for me with my ski pass lose simply for washing windows for your ass.

A magic touch window cleaning, Mark Goodban owner, 970-376-1066"

EAGLE POLICE DEPARTMENT CASE # 19-187: HARASSMENT-TELEPHONE-THREATS/OBSCENE

The Eagle Chief of Police received a direct report of offensive bumper stickers being placed on the Democratic Parties signs at 200 Broadway, in The Town of Eagle, in Eagle County, Colorado. The Reporting Party (RP) came into the Police Department and reported the incidents. The RP stated that multiple bumper stickers had been placed on signs in front of the Eagle County Building and up and down the alley where the Democratic Party office is at 233 Broadway. The RP stated that Dylan Roberts received an email with the picture of this bumper sticker on 09/12/2018. It came from this email address amagictouch007@gmail.com. The RP forwarded The Chief the picture of the bumper sticker that stated "Don't vote for Jarod Polis or he'll love your ass". This refers to Polis being openly homosexual. The RP was informed that a directive to patrol the above area more and pay attention to these signs on patrol.

EAGLE POLICE DEPARTMENT CASE # 19-456: HARASSMENT

Goodban had written crude and possibly offensive notes on letters and bills that he had received from the Eagle County Government. Goodban was calling Government employees "potheads", "Nazis", "Idiots" and several other derogatory names. The Eagle Police Chief consulted with the Avon Police Chief as well as

Eagle County Sheriff via email about Goodban. According to Avon Chief, this was Goodban's normal behavior. Goodban is known throughout Eagle County to be "anti-government". Eagle Chief, Avon Chief Daly and Eagle County Sheriff all agreed that Goodban was not breaking a law and was covered by the 1st Amendment. Eagle Chief asked that a report be taken so that Goodban's actions were properly documented.

Emails between Chiefs and Sheriff, talk about "red flagging" behavior and getting Hope Center involved.

AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT CRIMINAL CASE # 20-181: MENACING (Primary), HARASSMENT-OBSCENE LANGUAGE/GESTURE, STOP SIGN-FAIL TO STOP

On 03/15/2020 at 1950 hours Avon Police Officers were dispatched to a report of a Domestic Disturbance that had just occurred at the City Market in Avon. Officer A. Hernandez, along with Avon Police Sergeant J. Holmstrom and Avon Police Officer J. Mackey started responding to the scene in their marked patrol vehicles.

Dispatch informed the officers there was a customer inside City Market who "threatened to bring in guns" to the store. The offender was identified as Goodban.

Goodban threatened to bring back a gun to City Market due to being frustrated over a dispute on using electronic coupons. Goodban was advised to download the City Market app in order to redeem coupon discounts.

A witness reported to Officer Hernandez over the phone that Goodban was shopping inside City Market and was attempting to check out at the self-checkout registers. AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT CRIMINAL CASE # 20-467: DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On September 10, 2020, Goodban's neighbor (reporting party) reported he had been woken up just before 06:00 hours by loud pounding coming from near the entrance of his unit. He got up and went to his front door to investigate what the pounding was. He found the pounding was coming from inside B-3. He told me he called out to Goodban. He stated that Goodban quickly opened his front door. The RP asked Goodban what the problem was. Goodban responded "Mark from Vail Management is an asshole!"

The RP said the contact ended. He went on to explain that at 08:00Hrs as he was walking to his car to go to work, he encountered Goodban in the lot. He commented to Goodban that it was not 'OK' to make his problems the problems of all his neighbors. He said that Goodban then started to punch the exterior wall of the apartment building just outside his unit. He told Goodban he was going to call the Police. He said Goodban responded by screaming at him "Go ahead". Goodban was summonsed for Disorderly Conduct.

The respondent has been arrested for a crime listed in section 24-4.1-302(1)-Victims' Rights Crimes or section 18-9-202-Cruelty to Animals.

AVON POLICE DEPARTMENT CRIMINAL CASE # 21-424: FELONY MENACING-REAL/SIMULATED WEAPON (Primary), HARASSMENT, RECKLESS DRIVING, CARELESS DRIVING-**

On July 21, 2021, Mr. Goodban was charged with the above charges for brandishing a knife during a road rage incident. Vail Public Safety Communication's Center (VPSCC) aired a road rage in progress near

roundabout number three which is located at Avon Rd. and E Beaver Creek Blvd. Avon, CO. 81620, stating that the person was driving a Red Dodge Ram with a ladder rack on it. While in route, an Avon police officer called the reporting party/victim (RP) and he stated that he was pulling into the 7-Eleven parking lot. The Avon police officer told him that we would meet him at that location. After pulling into the 7-Eleven parking lot, Avon police met with the victim. The victim stated that the driver of the Red Ram was tailgating him, honking at him, and flipped him off and stated to dispatch at 15:57 that the driver "got out and showed the victim a (green in color and 4" blade) knife" and stated, "Quit following me or you will see what the consequences will be". The victim then stated to the driver of the Ram that he was calling 911. The driver of the Red Ram got back in his vehicle and drove Westbound on West Beaver Creek Blvd. The driver was later identified as Goodban. The victim stated that he felt threatened due to the actions of Goodban and was in fear for his life when Goodban was brandishing the knife. The victim stated that his fear was a seven out of ten, with ten being the worst.

Goodban has been known to be unpredictable with his behavior when agitated. There are numerous calls into the Vail Public Safety Communication's Center harassing the dispatchers for on-going perceived issues with Goodban and his neighbors who smoke tobacco and marijuana legally.

Goodban when feeling like his civil rights are being violated by town or state ordinances such as facial mask coverings, Styrofoam tray and plastic bag tax, he has harassed elected officials via email or in person. Goodban is no longer allowed to be present in the Avon Town Hall without the presence of Law Enforcement due to staff feeling unsafe around Goodban. The Town of Avon has spent over \$118,000 by placing bullet proof glass/ ballistic panels at Town Hall due to council members and staff feeling unsafe from Goodban. The installation was completed in December 2020.

Goodban will make passive aggressive threats to elected officials. An example is in an email to an Avon town council member, where Goodban referenced a mayor in Mexico who was dragged by a car by citizens for not keeping his word. Goodban has talked about having his 2nd amendment rights in a manner that would be perceived as a threat to elected officials.

Goodban has been ordered to a total of 20 hours of anger management through the 5th Judicial District since 2013 (Eagle County Cases: 21CR208; 2020m128; and 2013m45).

The last two criminal events Goodban was involved in included brandishing a weapon and threatening to return with firearms. Goodban behavior is escalating at every incident. The welfare of the community is a concern for the next time Goodban gets upset at what he perceives to be infringements of his rights and I have a concern that there is a the strong potential Goodban will follow through with using a firearm.

Summary

Throughout my investigation, I believe that Mark Goodban (DOB:09/12/1969) appears to have severe anti-government ideologies and has access to several weapons to include handguns and rifles. Goodban has exhibited extreme anti-social behaviors and does not appear to have the ability to control his anger. He has had numerous law enforcement contacts to include charges of DUI, Disorderly Conduct, Assault Menacing, Harassment, and numerous traffic violations.

Based on the foregoing, your affiant respectfully requests the Court to consider the Petition for Temporary Extreme Risk Protection Order for Goodban.



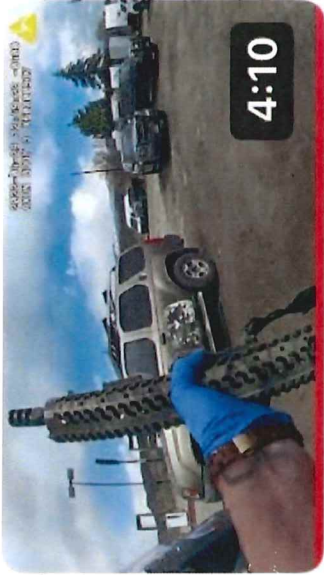

- ◆ The claim amount is limited to the value of \$25,000.00 in County Court. If the value of the property exceeds \$25,000.00 you must file in District Court.
- ◆ For additional information, please review Rule 104 of the Colorado Rules of Civil Procedure or Rule 404 of the Colorado Rules of County Court Civil Procedure.
- ◆ Your case must be filed in the county in which the property is located.
- ◆ If you have a disability and need a reasonable accommodation to access the courts, please contact your local ADA Coordinator. Contact information can be obtained from the following website:

Step 1: Complete appropriate forms.

- Verified Complaint in Replevin and Exhibit A (JDF 116).**
 - Fill in all the blanks on the Complaint form. You are the Plaintiff(s) and the person you are suing is the Defendant. If you are filing against multiple Defendants in the same action, list all of the Defendants.
 - In item six, state why you believe you are entitled to possession of the property; how the Defendant(s) took possession; and why you believe continued possession by the Defendant(s) is wrong.
 - You will need to list all property on Exhibit A that you are seeking to have returned to you and the approximate value of each property item listed. You may list property by category (e.g. books or videos), but items of significant value (e.g. televisions, stereos, furniture, jewelry) should be separately listed item by item.

- If you have any documents that can prove your right to possession of the property (such as certificate of title, contract, bill of sale, etc.), refer to the documents in this paragraph, attach copies to the Complaint, and identify as "Exhibit B". Keep the originals for presentation as evidence at trial.

- Summons (CRCCP Form 1) and Answer Under Simplified Civil Procedure (CRCCP Form 3).**
 - Complete the caption only on the Summons and Answer forms.
 - The Court will provide you with a case number, division, and courtroom when you file your case. When you receive this information enter it on both forms. In addition, enter the case number on the upper portion of the return of service, so that the Court can match this document to the appropriate case when filed back with the Court.

- Order to Show Cause (JDF 117) – Optional.**
 - Use this form if you asked for a Show Cause Hearing in the complaint.
 - Complete the caption only on this form.
 - The Court will complete the applicable sections.
 - The Court will give you a hearing date, that shall not be more than 14 days from the date the order is issued and the order must have been served at least 7 days prior to the hearing date.

Step 2: You are ready to file your case with the Court.

- Provide the Court with the documents completed as described in Step 1 above.
- Pay the filing fee.

Step 3: You are ready to have the Defendant(s) served.

You are responsible for paying the service fees, if any. Personal service must be made by someone who is 18 years or older and not a party to the action. Service must be completed at least 7 days before the appearance/answer date. Complete the following process based on the type of service selected:

Personal Service:

- Select either the Sheriff's Department, a private process server, or someone you know who is 18 years or older and not a party to the action and who knows the rules of service to serve each Defendant. There is a service fee that is payable to the Sheriff's Department or Private Process Server. The fee for service is usually awarded as part of your court costs if the court rules in your favor.
 - You can locate private process servers in the yellow pages under Process Servers.
 - Provide the person who will complete service a set of the following forms for each Defendant:
 - Summons (CRCCP 1), Verified Complaint in Replevin (JDF 116), Order to Show Cause (JDF 117), and Answer (CRCCP 3). In addition, attach the appropriate exhibits.
 - Provide the process server with an Affidavit of Service (JDF 98) for each Defendant.
 - The process server will return the original Summons to you with the Affidavit of Service completed.
 - Each Defendant must be served at least 7 days before the appearance day specified in the summons.

Step 4: Service is complete.

Return the original Summons (CRCCP Form 1) with proof of service (Affidavit of Service JDF 98) to the Clerk on or before the date you are to appear in Court.

Step 5: Show Cause Hearing (If Ordered by the Court)

Appear on your court date. If you fail to appear, your case may be dismissed.

- Be prepared for your hearing and bring the following forms.
 - Judgment and Order for Possession (JDF 118)
 - Prejudgment Order for Possession After Hearing (JDF 119)
 - Bond in Replevin (JDF 120)

Step 6: Court's Ruling.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Court has several options. The following are the more common options:

- The Court may enter a Judgment and Order for Possession in your favor. If the Court does this, it means you have won your case, and the Defendant will be ordered to return the property to you. If this is the result of your hearing, you should present to the Judge a Judgment and Order for Possession (JDF 118) for his/her signature. Attach a copy of 'Exhibit A' to the Order.
- The Court may enter a Prejudgment Order for Possession after Hearing, if it is determined that you are entitled to possession of the property pending a final hearing. If this is the result of your hearing, you should present to the Judge the Prejudgment Order of Possession after Hearing (JDF 119) for his/her signature. Attach a copy of 'Exhibit A' to the Order. The Court will set another hearing date for final resolution. In the interim, the Court's Order will direct the Sheriff's Office to take all the property from the Defendant and keep it in its custody until further order.
- The Court may require a bond before ordering the Sheriff to seize the property, to protect the rights of the parties. If you are required to post a bond, complete the Bond in Replevin (JDF 120).
- The Court may continue the hearing to another date to allow additional testimony.
- The Court may deny your request for possession on the grounds that the Court does not find that you are entitled to an Order for Possession. If the Court denies your claim, the Court may set your case for another hearing at which time you can bring additional proof of your right to possession, or judgment will be entered for the Defendant and your case will be dismissed.

Step 7: Following the Hearing.

What you need to do following the hearing depends upon how the Judge rules at the hearing.

- If the Judge ruled in your favor and awarded you a Judgment and Order for Possession (JDF 118), the Defendant may return the property to you. If the property is not returned, you will need to obtain from the Clerk of Court a certified copy of the Court's Order. You will need to prepare a Writ of Assistance (JDF 121) for the Clerk of Court to issue. Both documents must be provided to the Sheriff to seize the property and return it to you.
- If the Judge issued a Prejudgment Order for Possession After Hearing (JDF 119), you will need to obtain from the Clerk of Court a certified copy of that Order. You will need to provide a Writ of Assistance (JDF 121) for the Clerk of Court to issue. Both documents must be provided to the Sheriff to seize the property and return it to you. You and your witnesses will also need to attend any subsequent hearing that the Court may set.
- If the Judge continued the hearing to another date, you and your witnesses will need to attend at that time.
- If the Judge entered a judgment for the Defendant and dismissed your case, you have lost the case and will not be granted possession of the property.

Step 8: Return of the Property.

If the property is returned to you through the Sheriff's Office, the Sheriff's Office is entitled to payment of its fees and expenses for seizing and storing the property during the time prior to releasing the property to you. If you do pay such fees or expenses, you should take your receipt to the Clerk of Court's Office to be recorded as court costs, which may then be collected from the Defendant.

Step 9: Examine Your Property.

Once your property is returned to you, you should examine it carefully and make a complete inventory of what was returned. Determine whether all of your property has been returned and whether it is in the same condition as when it was taken. If any of your property is missing, or has been damaged or destroyed, you are entitled to make a supplemental application to the Court for an award of damages against the Defendant to pay for your loss.

My name is Denise Madrid, and I support HB26-1275.

My family is made up of immigrants, and I am married to a Colombian immigrant. Immigration enforcement has affected my life in ways most people never have to consider.

In 2011, when I was a child, my father was taking me to school when ICE agents stopped us outside our home and took him into custody. I will never forget the fear of watching him being taken away while I stood there helpless. Thankfully, with a lawyer, we were able to secure his release.

But many in my family were not so fortunate.

In 2009, my uncle Ruben Madrid was deported after a minor traffic violation that led to unpaid fines and jail time. Instead of being released after serving his sentence, he was deported — and later murdered in Mexico.

In 2010, my other uncle, Omar Madrid, was deported under similar circumstances. He too was later killed.

These were not violent criminals. They were family members who made small mistakes and paid the ultimate price.

When officers act without clear identification or accountability, families like mine are left powerless and terrified.

HB26 matters because transparency and accountability in immigration enforcement can prevent these tragedies. I urge you to support this bill.

Testimony in Support of HB26-1275: Visible and Accountable Policing Act

Chair and Members of the Committee,

My name is Anne Keke, and I am writing in strong support of HB26-1275.

I am an immigrant from Côte d'Ivoire and an active, engaged member of my community. I care deeply about public safety, civil rights, and ensuring that everyone in Colorado feels protected and respected under the law.

This bill is both necessary and timely.

Across the country, we are seeing growing fear and confusion caused by law enforcement officers—particularly federal agents—who conceal their identities, use excessive force, and operate without transparency. These actions erode trust between communities and law enforcement, making it harder for people to report crimes, cooperate with officers, and feel safe in their own neighborhoods.

HB26-1275 establishes clear and reasonable expectations. Requiring officers to identify themselves promotes accountability. Ensuring that federal law enforcement can be held accountable under state law reinforces that no one is above the law. And requiring intervention in cases of excessive force helps prevent harm and protect lives.

For immigrant communities, these protections are especially critical. When individuals cannot tell whether someone is a legitimate officer or acting unlawfully, fear takes hold. That fear isolates communities and ultimately makes all of us less safe.

I also want to note that it is unfortunate that remote testimony was not allowed. Limiting access to participation excludes many voices—particularly those most impacted—who may not be able to attend in person.

I join organizations like BASIC, Faith Leaders in Action, and the Interfaith Immigration Network in urging your support.

Colorado should continue to lead in transparency, accountability, and civil rights. I respectfully ask for a yes vote on HB26-1275.
