Fiscal Assessment of L.001 to HB26-1334

This memorandum is an assessment of the fiscal impact of the attached proposed amendment L.001 to House Bill 26-1334. This fiscal assessment is for the impact of the bill with inclusion of this amendment only. Any other added amendment could influence the fiscal impact.

Summary of Proposed Amendment

Amendment L.001 eliminates the requirement that the Wildfire Resiliency Code Board (board) in the Division of Fire Prevention and Control in the Department of Public Safety review the statewide standards to reduce wildfire risk by July 1, 2026. It also removes the requirement that the board establish a process allowing a person impacted by wildland urban interface-related codes to petition the board for modifications.

Fiscal Impact of Amendment

Amendment L.001 eliminates the state expenditure impact of \$81,685 and 0.7 FTE in FY 2026-27, and \$58,130 and 0.8 FTE in FY 2027-28, identified in the initial fiscal note dated March 26, 2026.

Bill's Revised Fiscal Impact with Amendment

With adoption of L.001, the bill only provides an extension for local governments to align local codes with statewide codes and standards, which may reduce costs and workload in FY 2026-27 for local governments that delay updating codes. No appropriation is required.
