I previously served as a director within a public school district, and I am currently a candidate for House District 3. I am offering these comments from the perspective of someone who has worked directly within school systems and understands how funding decisions impact students, staff, and operations.</p> <p>SB26-023, the School Finance Act, plays a critical role in determining how resources are distributed across Colorado’s public education system. In my experience, funding decisions at the state level directly shape what schools are able to provide”from staffing and programming to student supports and long-term planning.</p> <p>This year’s adjustments to base per-pupil funding are an important step in maintaining stability for school districts as they plan and operate in a changing environment.</p> <p>Consistency, predictability, and transparency in school funding are essential. District leaders rely on stable and understandable funding structures to make responsible decisions that affect</p>
