

Vote Yes on House Bill 1241

Colorado's K-12 community supports a strong accountability system, including standardized testing. We have a legal and ethical responsibility to focus state resources on schools that need the most support to increase the growth of students and to hit achievement targets.

House Bill 1241 creates a 25-member task force of practitioners and stakeholders to study academic opportunities, inequities, promising practices in schools and improvements to the accountability and accreditation system. Appointments will be made by the Governor's office and legislative leadership with the following breakdown: Speaker (5), Sen President (5), Minority Leader in House (4), Minority Leader in Senate (4), and Governor (6).

As part of it's work, the taskforce will be charged with reviewing the accountability audit released in December 2022, promising practices from districts both in and outside of Colorado, and information and findings from districts who are participating in Colorado's Accountability Pilot Program.

A yes vote on House Bill 1241 creates the mechanism through which we can explore the next iteration of our education accountability system to better meet the needs of students, families, educators and local communities.
