

SB23-109 IS EXTREME AND OUT OF STEP WITH COLORADO'S NEIGHBOR STATES.



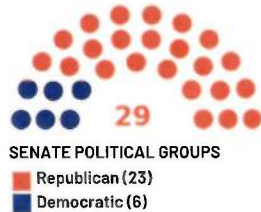

Utah Bill **SB23-254**: Drug Induced Homicide Amendments

Failed Senate 2nd reading

- 21-5 (3 excused)
- 4 Ds (all) voted no
- 17 Rs voted no



"We appear to be absolving the person who is actually ingesting the drugs...and I'm concerned that we take a person who has no intent to kill and charg[e] them with murder."

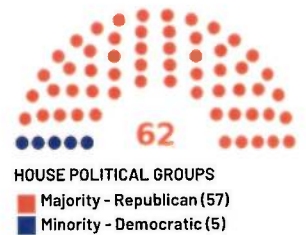

Wyoming Bill **SF0181**: Drug Induced Homicide

Failed House 3rd reading

- 38-23 (1 excused)
- 5 Ds (all) voted no
- 33 Rs voted no

SB23-109 is **more extreme** than the DIH bills that failed in Utah & Wyoming.
